Larger group of people/organizations invested in the vision of the Pyramid Model Initiative

- Develop and sustain infrastructure to support program wide implementation;
- Disseminate information about the Pyramid Model priorities, actions, and accomplishments, including messaging to families;

- Share resources that support the work of the Pyramid Model action plan;
- Understand and integrate practices promoted by the Pyramid Model into state infrastructure



OUR ASKS

Making Regional Connections

Regional Leads as Connectors

Promoting awareness of program wide

- Availability to present or overview or discuss or share at the invitation of the connector
- Represent the Pyramid Model framework at regional councils, workgroups, committees

Building/holding relationships with Early Care and Education connectors in the community (where do providers go to get information?)

- Meeting with these connectors to give and get information (feedback loop)

Holding a resource map of the region related to Pyramid Model/ Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health

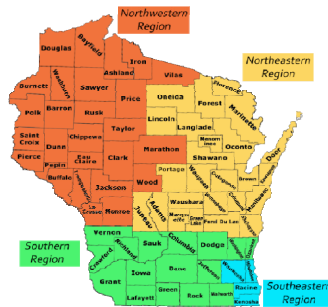
- Knowing what is happening in the region
- Knowing who are doing work in the region
- Knowing what may be needed in each region

Convening PM/I-ECMH individuals within a community of practice

- Ensure there is understanding of community wide elements/ program wide elements and why

Ensuring understanding of where and what PM resources exist on state and national webpages

- Building “understanding and integration”
- Sharing about the effort and resources
- Highlighting the potential impact
