Reflective Supervision Learning Collaborative

WI-AIMH continued to offer the 12-month Reflective Supervision Learning Collaborative (RSLC) in 2023. Our 5th RSLC cohort, composed of 15 infant/early childhood professionals, completed the program in June and a new cohort composed of 20 infant/early childhood professionals began in August 2023. **The RSLC continues to demonstrate strong outcomes!**

Below are some responses from our 5th RSLC cohort:

- \cdot 82% strongly agreed; and 18% agreed that the RSLC adequately prepared them to provide RSC within their agency or program
- \cdot 100% of survey takers would recommend the RSLC to other IMH professionals

2023 Program Highlights


WI Pyramid Model

Our Pyramid Model team expanded to match our vision of Regional Leads in each area of the state and embrace a co-Director structure. This rich infrastructure resulted in Wisconsin **achieving** 82% of the 49 indicators in place on the Pyramid Model State Leadership Team Benchmarks of Quality. Wisconsin welcomed nine new sites working toward program wide implementation, totaling a number of 66 program sites, of the Pyramid Model framework. WI-AIMH staff provided 16 Pyramid Model practitioner, coach and team trainings for more than 235 participants.



Healthy Minds Healthy Children

It was a fast and incredible year for the Healthy Minds Healthy Children (HMHC) Consultation Program! In its first year, HMHC onboarded eight Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Consultants (IECMHC) and two Consultant Mentors; provided over 350 hours of professional development trainings to the mental health and early care and education (ECE) workforce: and facilitated 25 Community Level Consultation events that reached over 970 people in Wisconsin. The team is currently serving 14 sites (and counting) in Milwaukee and the Southeastern Region, while looking to expand to the Northern and Southern Regions. Programs receiving consultation have shared positive feedback and appreciation that HMHC offers a variety of consultation activities to help providers and families.













Infant Mental Health Endorsement®

With more than 150 professionals Endorsed, we continued to see more Wisconsin professionals earn Infant Mental Health-Endorsement® for Culturally Sensitive, Relationship-Focused Practice Promoting Infant Mental Health. In August we eliminated the application registration and processing fees to support increased access to Endorsement for all professionals. We also secured **Endorsement Coordination through the** Alliance for the Advancement of Infant Mental Health, to ensure professionals have timely and responsive application support and technical assistance. Finally, we started building infrastructure for the Early Childhood Endorsement! Four infant/early childhood Wisconsin professionals earned Early Endorsement, and are prepared to support others in the process by serving as Endorsement application reviewers.
